One Day tour to Village Sitarampeth, Dist. Chandrapur.

One-day tour was organised by the Dept. of Environmental Science in coordination with Dept. of Botany of Gramgeeta Mahavidyalaya, Chimur on dated 06.01.2020 to village Sitarampeth, Dist. Chandrapur under the guidance of Prof. Bijan Kumar Shil, Prof. Maladhari Sartaj Shaikh and Prof. Pradnya Khobragade along with LA Mr. Dekhate. Total 40 nos. of students were visited the village. The visiting team started from college at 8.30 am and reached the village at 11.00 pm and complete the formalities at Grampanchayat office of village Sitarampeth. All the students along with teachers has signed in the Gramsabha Book and attended the meeting organised by Grampanchayat office of village Sitarampeth. The Grampanchayat has assigned Mr. Shankar Bharde for guiding the visiting team.

After that the team moves towards the Forest Area of village Sitarampeth along with Mr. Bharde. Bharde sir has given the information about the village. According to Census 2011 information the location code or village code of Sitarampeth village is 541184. Sitarampeth village is located in Bhadravati Tehsil of Chandrapur district in Maharashtra, India. It is situated 45 km away from sub-district headquarter Bhadravati and 60 km away from district headquarter Chandrapur. As per 2009 stats, Bhamdeli is the gram panchayat of Sitarampeth village. The total geographical area of village is 974.24 hectares. Sitarampeth has a total population of 234 peoples. There are about 56 houses in Sitarampeth village. Chandrapur is nearest town to Sitarampeth which is approximately 32km away.

The forest of Sitarampeth has the good example of forest management. Without taking any fund from government the villagers are maintaining the forest very

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well. They are managing the fund from local residents of village and taking care of the forest on their own.

After that under the Guidance of Prof. Shil students studied the forest area. Prof. Shil has made the groups of students for study. Then students started to draw the quadrates of sizes 2x2, 5x5, 10x10 and 20x20 and note down the numbers, girth and local names of plant species found in the particular quadrates. Students noted the names of plant species were Neem, Palas, Amaltas, Bargad, Deodar etc.

All the students got the very knowledgeable information from the visit and acquainted with various factors of forest study and had a lot of fun.
